### Safeguarding Update:

Safeguarding children is the action we take to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm. Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility. Every single person who comes into contact with children and families has a role to play. You will see on the right of this page information about who to speak to if you have concerns about a child's safety or welfare, however all our staff are trained in safeguarding if you want to discuss any concerns with them.

Spotlight on: County lines.

County Lines is when gangs and organised crime groups exploit children to transport and sell drugs, normally between big cities where the exploiters are based to smaller towns, sometimes across county boundaries but also locally and within the county. Children as young as 6 are known to have been targeted by gangs for this purpose.

# RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Why not find your cooking apron and chef hat (if you have one or make one), get creative in the kitchen this weekend and try the following recipe. Don't forget to send the office a pictures of your creation.

## MACARONI CHEESE

#### Ingredients

- 50g baguette, cut into small chunks
- <u>2 tbsp butter</u>, plus 1 tbsp melted
- 350g spiral or other short pasta
- <u>1 garlic clove</u>, finely chopped
- <u>1 tsp English mustard</u> powder
- <u>3 tbsp plain flour</u>
- 500ml whole milk
- 250g <u>vegetarian mature cheddar</u>,

grated

• 50g <u>parmesan</u> (or vegetarian alternative), grated



### Method

#### STEP 1

 Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Spread the baguette chunks over a <u>baking sheet</u>, drizzle with the melted butter and season. Bake for 6 mins until crisp, then set aside.

#### STEP 2

Boil the pasta for 2 mins less than stated on the pack, then drain. Meanwhile, melt the butter in a <u>saucepan</u>
Add the garlic and English mustard powder, cook for 1 min, then stir in the plain flour.

#### STEP 3

 Cook for 1 min more, then gradually <u>whisk</u> in the milk until you have a lump-free sauce. Simmer for 5 mins, whisking all the time until thickened. Take off the heat, then stir in the cheddar and half the parmesan.

#### STEP 4

• Stir the pasta and some seasoning into the cheesy sauce. Tip into a large ovenproof dish, or four individual

## dishes.

#### STEP 5

• Scatter over the bread and the remaining parmesan, then bake for 20 mins until crisp and golden. Can be frozen before baking – defrost thoroughly before cooking.


# READING CORNER



# Behaviour

Children show us how they are feeling in the way they behave. The reasons might be more obvious at some times than others. It is affected by age, understanding, experiences and personality.

Behaviour is a way of communicating. It can take time to work out what children are trying to tell us. Changes in behaviour might be because of;

- · Change or family difficulties such as starting school or parental conflict.
- · A need for more boundaries, routines or activity in day to day life.
- How they deal with information from their senses finding some noises, smells or situations 'too much'.

It is common to worry that behaviour is caused by a condition or diagnosis, but it is always important to think about other causes for behaviour. These could be worries, frustration, tiredness, hunger or pain.

Children with additional needs that experience some behaviour difficulties will still benefit from being responded to in a calm, kind way and from routines and boundaries, alongside any extra help they might need.



Who are you? Vicky Gateshill


What is your role in the Sunflower Federation? Year 5/6 teacher
